Middle School Art: We started off the year with a little *All About M*, so as a new art teacher I will get to know the students better. We did a silhouette drawing of ourselves, filled the inside with words and pictures that describe us, our final step was to watercolor the background. Our second project of the year, which we have just started, is *Fall Optical Art. Ms. Henning*

Musical Notes: This week we welcomed our new music teacher--Mrs. Allison McCawley. Mrs. McCawley is shared with Our Lady of Assumption School in Beloit. This year we have adopted the *Quaver Music Curriculum* that provides lessons with movement videos, activities, interactives, games, and assignments. Assessments are built into the lesson structure to measure student acquisition of their skills. We are also in the process of learning the Mass of St. Mary Magdalene to be sung at weekly and Sunday Masses.

Middle School Physical Education:

We have begun the year focusing on movement and getting comfortable with our new classmates! So far, we have played multiple team games emphasizing cooperation and teamwork. We are excited to be incorporating more of our community to expose our students to lifelong fitness opportunities. This past Friday we visited the outdoor fitness area placed across the street from the YMCA which was donated to the city by SSM Health. This fitness area incorporates different bodyweight equipment ranging from beginner to advanced movement patterns. Our idea is to expose our students to exercise and emphasize the importance of movement in our everyday lives. We hope this becomes a life-long goal for the future of our students.
